The SAY programme is specifically designed for students outside the EEA who wish to develop their skills and fluency in English, develop transferable digital and business skills and enjoy a unique experience of living and studying in Galway. SAY programme consists of 25 weeks tuition and 8 weeks holidays and it gives students the opportunity to work part-time while studying.

These courses are designed for non-native English speakers to build confidence, participate and learn by doing, seeing, and traveling. Students interested in attending university or college in Ireland are encouraged to take advantage of the university pathways programmes delivered at GCI.

Our Study Abroad Academic Year programmes are specifically designed for non-EEA students. The SAY programmes can be structured to suit everyone's requirements and a suitable study path is designed for the student based on the starting level, academic needs and learning objectives.

PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHTS

Start any Monday

- 25 weeks tuition + 8 weeks holidays
- 20 lessons/week
- SAY English is suitable for any levels
- SAY Business is suitable for B1+ levels
- Students must be a minimum of 18
- Attendance is obligatory but failure to have 85% attendance may result in your visal being withdrawn
- Students are allowed to work part-time (20 hrs/week) while studying
- Students are allowed to work full time (40 hrs/week) during the holidays
- Medical insurance is obligatory
- Classes start any Monday, except for bank holidays and set dates for SAY Business.
- GCI is a testing centre for Cambridge
- Students must sit an international examination at the end of their course.
- Holiday weeks must be decided prior to arrival
- SAY Business have set holidays as per GBS academic timetable
- You need a Social Security number (PPS) to work, and the minimum wage is €10.50

Visa Process

- Students need to book and pay for the full course before departure for Ireland.
- Students must have a minimum of 4 weeks accommodation organised in advance.
- Students must have medical insurance organised in advance.
- When you arrive at the airport, Immigration usually stamps your passport with a visa for one month.

To validate your visa after arrival in Ireland, you need to:

- Open a bank account and deposit €3,000 in that bank account (we help you with the procedures).
- Get letters from the bank, the school and proof of medical insurance.
- Go to Immigration (GNIB) with your passport and all the necessary documents (we help you with the procedures).
- The visa / IRP Irish Residence Permit card costs €300.
